





City of Marfa

Additional Water Well

- Drill and equip a new water well to replace existing well that has reached the end of its projected useful life
- City currently operates 2 water wells
- \$705,000 through first round of State Water Implementation Fund for Texas (SWIFT) funding
- Rural project

TWDB FUNDED PROJECT

Lee County Fresh Water Supply District No. 1 New Ground Storage & Pump Station

- Construct new storage tanks to replace those not meeting TCEQ criteria
- Provides service to Dime Box, TX
- Service population of 390
- Qualified for very small systems funding
- Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) \$525,000 and \$351,839 Loan Forgiveness (Very Small Systems)


City of Arlington Replacement of Sanitary Sewer Lines

- Replacing existing sanitary sewer lines in targeted areas that have the most deteriorated lines
- Replacing approx. 19,075 linear feet of water lines with 4 to 24 inch piping
- Clean Water State Revolving Fund \$4,775,000 and \$826,861 Loan Forgiveness for Green Project Funding




LUCE BAYOU INTERBASIN TRANSFER PROJECT
